2) MINUTES OF 1984 AGM

3) CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

First, thanks must go to Hilary Fairlie who took over as treasurer in the middle of the year; to Ken Ovens for organising the Scottish Relays and producing the newsletter; and to Pete Couldery for planning the Scottish Relays, organising the Norman's Law badge event and acting as Social Secretary.

We were very narrowly beaten by FVO in the CompassSport Cup, losing by

Events put on in the last year were a badge event at Norman's Law, a Lothian-O-League in Colinton Dell and the Scottish Relays which were made even more successful by Charlie Walton's excellent P.A. commentary. Alot more juniors have joined the club so we have been putting on junior training events about once a month.

A mapping course was organised in November with instruction given by Andy Curtis (ESOC). 12-15 people attended the course and as a result Ewes Hill is being mapped. I am also looking into remapping Gullane for a badge event.

The club newsletter has been combined with ESOCs newsletter to give a larger joint newsletter, which has been an improvement although more Interloper articles are needed.

All Interloper and ESOC socials are now open to both clubs with the clubs

holding socials on alternate months. For the future, we are organising day 2 of Tayside '85 at Drummond Hill and hopefully will use the area for a badge event in 1986. Thanks to the members of the committee for their work.

4) FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Total funds increased by £125.03 in the last financial year, but this was due to a mapping grant of £150 so the situation is not very healthy.

Newsletter expenses are now greater due to a fatter newsletter.

The Lothian O-League made most money with a profit of £96 and we lost £38 in unrecovered relay entries.

We have less in the building society and bank but this is made up for by Orienteering suit stocks of £103 and debtors of £65.

The financial statement was accepted by the meeting. This was proposed

by R. Heyworth and seconded by P. Woolverton.

The treasurer proposed that membership fees remain the same next year but might have to be increased in 1987 if event income did not increase.
