


and moving further afield, the Waltons. Not to Lookout Mountain but I'll let Charlie's e-mail do the talking.




as well as standing for did not finish, on this page it means do not forget!



They sound as if they might enjoy orienteering but ask yourselves are these really the sort of people we should be attracting to our sport? Haven't we got enough 'anoraks' already?





More Moons For Jupiter By Dr David Whitehouse BBC News Online Science Editor

Astronomers have discovered 11 new, small moons circling Jupiter. They were discovered by a team led by Scott Sheppard and David Jewitt from the University of Hawaii's Institute for Astronomy. When added to the 11 found last year by the same team, they bring the total of Jupiter satellites to 39, more than any other planet. "We found them in a deliberate survey with the world's largest digital camera last December," Dr Jewitt told BBC News Online. We are more familiar with the major moons like Io and Europa"By following suspect objects for a few months, we were able to eliminate asteroid interlopers to settle on our final set of 11 irrefutable satellites," says Dr Jewitt.


