There was an equally long list of Interlopers selected for the Home Internationals. And Matthew Murray and Matthew Galloway were chosen for the World Schools. Well done everyone and apologies to anyone I have missed!

The list of domestic successes was too long for this report, but I would like to highlight 3 particularly outstanding results:

1. Interlopers won the prestigious JK Open Relay (Anthony Squire, Oleg Chepelin and Murray Strain).
2. Interlopers came third in the Compass Sport Trophy.

3. Interlopers were ranked number 1 club in Britain for part of the year.

The Interlopers achievements also included 13 events staged, major contributions to several non-Interloper events, support to a number of schools, a training weekend, social events, and more.

We also have fancy new O tops and a renewed sponsorship deal with Compass Point (it includes discount for Interloper members if you ask when making a purchase). Please support our sponsor, especially if you are stocking up on kit at the forthcoming 6-Day event.

Looking ahead, the next event is the bi-annual Scottish 6-Day. Interlopers are the lead club for Day 4 Torinturk (Thur 4<sup>th</sup> August 2011) and our volunteer main officials; Paul Caban, Graham McIntyre, Colin Eades and Ken Daly have been busy planning, organising and controlling (I think it would be fair to say that Paul has put in a massive amount of work and deserves extra recognition – so thank you Paul!).

I have visited Torinturk and can report that it is a stunning venue with some excellent O terrain and courses. I recommend you take time to look at the views (behind you) as you race past the opposition. Please also remember that we need everyone to help as well as run – come prepared for a long day and stay to the bitter end as there is always a lot of dismantling, etc., required: Your reward will be a fabulous BBQ the following evening – thanks to our hosts Tim and Lucy (see separate advert).

The clubs other major commitment is the JK Sprint at Livingston next Easter (6<sup>th</sup> April 2012), but more on that another day.

Keeping with our past promises we are concentrating more of our efforts closer to

home, such as the Braids Scottish Night Champs earlier this; the street O series; and the use of Livingston for the JK Sprint. With this in mind and an aspiration I have for Interlopers to have an annual 'flagship' event, I hope to launch an Interlopers Twin Weekend, probably commencing 5&6 November 2011 by adding a Night O before our club and ESOA Champs at Dechmont & Deans (watch this space).

**Belfast and County Down**

Ann asked me if I could write a few words about the JK only a couple of weeks after the event when it was still fresh in my mind, but of course I am only getting round to it now after Ann's second prompt for Newsletter articles and am having to dredge it up from my memory. My main

recollections are excellent orienteering in sunny and beautiful Northern Ireland, staying in a somewhat basic holiday house with my Mum and Dad, which, despite falling down blinds and a leaking washing machine, felt like home by the end of our stay.

Having resident babysitters came into its own when Graeme and I headed up to the Sprint at Stranmillis College in Belfast; much less hassle without 3 small boys in tow. It was well-organised, warm and sunny, and a great taster for what was in store for us for the rest of the weekend. At last years JK I had won a silver, bronze and gold medal in the sprint, individual and relay events, respectively, much to my surprise and delight (competition isn't that tough in W35!). However, this year, knowing it was within the realms of possibility, I was hoping to achieve some success again. I really enjoyed the sprint, a couple of small mistakes in the first half and one long moment of bafflement coming out of control 21 as my brain just seized up after having been concentrating so hard (it's not used to it!), I finished in a respectable time of 18:07 mins. I hoped it might get me a medal and although beaten by Helen Pearce by quite a considerable margin I did come away with a silver medal so a good start to the weekend.

Day 2 took us to Tyrella South, complex sand dunes. I went out with some trepidation, knowing how hard sand dunes are and wondering if I would be able to read or make sense of the map. After finding the first couple of controls, despite being slow and hesitant, I started to realise the map did work and continued round the course fairly successfully. I was utterly shattered by the last few controls so really had to work hard at keeping it together and just managed to. So a fairly solid start to the 2-day competition.

Day 3 was up in the mountains at Slieve Croob and Cratlieve. Spectacular views and another mostly dry day. I lost 3 or 4 mins on control 4, for once thinking 'I'm not going to go and check that control I can see over there just in case it's mine, 'cos I know it isn't', and then proceeded to plod about for a while feeling confused. In the end I did, found it was my no. 5 only ~50 m from my no. 4 – aargh. The rest was ok although another minute lost towards the end when I dashed off down a hill only to realise I then needed to slog back up it to the gate. So I finished feeling a bit frustrated with myself and hoping I could hold onto a medal position but I would have to be lucky. In the end I was, and came away with the bronze.

Making full use of our babysitters, Graeme and I went to the Social Event on the Sunday evening at Slieve Donard Hotel in Newcastle. I think the Carcas family were the only other Interlopers there. It started with Pippa Archer and Hector Haines talking us through their Sprint and Classic races, respectively. I was amazed to hear how much preparation they put into their runs beforehand, including using Google maps in Pippa's case to suss out the area. Perhaps that's where I'm going wrong! This was followed by an eclectic mix of Irish, Scottish and Indian songs and dancing. It made a change anyway and it's always a pleasure just to be out!

So my results for the weekend so far were exactly the same as last years. Could we win the W120+ relay again? This year's team was Heather Hartman, Jane Ackland and myself, and it was back to Tyrella West. Heather had a good run and came in 2<sup>nd</sup>. There was a little gang of us 3<sup>rd</sup> leg runners waiting in the changeover pen which began to make me feel nervous as we eagerly watched out for our team runners. In the end FVOs Louise Longhurst came in first, handing over to Beccy Osborn, but less than a minute later

I was off taking over from Jane with Beccy in my sights. Neither of us started well, it was tough with a long leg out into those tricky dunes. I had expected the map to be fantastically clear at the 1:7500 but it didn't seem to be!

Anyway I knew that I had crept just ahead of Beccy at no. 1 and managed to keep that lead going into the urban section. I was quick and efficient going through the buildings, bearing in mind Heather's advice to check the descriptions carefully for exact positioning of controls. It was good to be announced in the lead as I came through the last control. So a great finish to a super weekend of orienteering and happy to be returning home with 3 photo momentos of each area.

Junior Interlopers did very well at the Scottish Schools Orienteering festival which was held at Scone Palace in June 2011. The competition had to be rescheduled to June 22<sup>nd</sup>, after a great deal of storm damage prevented it taking place in early June – on what turned out to be the warmest day of the year. The grounds staff had an enormous job to deal with the amount of debris including a huge number of very old trees which had come down. Consequently the planner had to replan many of the courses, and some changes were made at the last minute. Luckily the new date turned out to be a lovely day too and everyone enjoyed the nice conditions whether they were running, or spectating. There were a few absences due to important school dates, but the turnout was still very high and ran very smoothly on the day with 340 competitors.

**EYOC 2011**  
**Czech Republic**  
*Christopher Galloway*

As some of you may know, I was recently selected to represent Britain at the European Youth Champs in the Czech Republic. My trip started with a short flight with the rest of the Scottish contingent (Rona and Rhona) down to Stansted airport where we spent the night in a Holiday Express. Then early the next morning we met up with the rest of the GB team and flew to Brno. The flight was a great laugh as I got to know the members of the team I hadn't previously met. When we arrived we picked up our hire cars and drove the 2 hour journey to Jindrichuv Hradec. The one thing that struck me as we drove through Czech was the number

of forests as the majority of the landscape was covered. We got to our final destination at about 6 o'clock local time so we had a quick meal, wandered about the town with a practice sprint map and went off to bed in order to be fresh for the first event the following day.

The next morning we had a relatively long lie (8:30) before having breakfast and heading off for a quick look at the practice long area before the sprint race. The map was covered with vegetation boundaries, the paths were very unclear and the boulders they mapped were huge so it was a bit different from the maps in Britain. After a short jog around we were back in the cars and off to Trebon, the destination for the sprint race.

Before setting off from Scotland, I had prepared by looking at the town on Google Earth so I knew vaguely what to expect. The courses were largely park based with some urban legs which made for fast orienteering. My start was late so I was left hanging around for a while watching as the rest of team went off one by one. I had a reasonable run, but made some stupid mistakes on the way including trying to find the start kite. The starters didn't tell me where it was, so I assumed it must have been at the actual start. This led to me standing lost at the first corner for about 5 seconds and then taking the wrong route to the first control, overall losing about 20 seconds, a bad start! I made another mistake at number 9, going the wrong way when I hit a path which lost me about half a minute so I was pretty frustrated going through the spectator control. The rest of the course was fine and I ended up coming 20<sup>th</sup> which was pretty good, but I was frustrated about the mistakes which cost me a top 6 finish. Then after a quick warm down we had to go to the opening ceremony where each team was welcomed to the Czech Republic and introduced to the rest of the nations.

The next day was the Long race and we had to get up at 6:30 in order to have breakfast and be on the road by 7:30. Unlike the previous day my start was early so I didn't have to hang around the quarantine area for ages, so after a quick run about on the warm up map I was ready to go. I had decide to start slowly in order to hit the first couple of controls and then work my way into the map so I got the first four reasonably well. After that however, I had a control isolated in a patch of dark green. I lost concentration and ended up well off losing about 6 minutes on that and then 5 minutes on the next control. From then on I went cautiously and still made some careless mistakes losing another 5 minutes so it was a bit of a bad run. I ended up about 55<sup>th</sup> which is pretty rubbish, but at least it showed me that I am capable of competing at this level if improve my navigation.

That night was the party which was actually quite good apart from some of the dodgy German beats that got played, so everyone went to bed happy. The next morning was chaotic however, as we had to get up at half six and them had to pack ready to

leave for the airport after the relays. The relays were a complete disaster for me as I had an absolutely terrible run, losing at least 20 minutes and losing a shoe at the spectator control. To add to that it was also raining so I finished very cold and crying (not cool!!). My first leg runner (Matt) had had a good run and so did our 3<sup>rd</sup> leg runner (Aidan) so we still finished a respectable 10<sup>th</sup> place, but my leg is something I would happily forget. The rest of the team were very supportive of me despite my catastrophic run and after a chat with the coaches I was feeling a lot better. Then we were on the plane home. (Time flies when you are having fun.)

Overall it was a fantastic experience, I made a lot of great friends and the coaches were really good (they are going to help me with my navigation at the Cairngorm camp in the summer). EYOC was a fantastic experience and has only emphasised how much I need to focus on my navigation in order to be the best.



## Scottish 6 Day Update

I write this piece as I am just back from three days putting out controls, seventy of them, all away from the road and a few contours up. Having been away from Torinturk for almost two months, the place has now passed from spring to summer. Most notably, the bracken is now up, but in all but one or two cases, is exactly as had been mapped, and won't impede passage too much. Also, the ground is pretty dry too, and even the "long-orange" bog – you've been warned – is only about ankle deep.

The big news from the courses is that the bridge across the Lonan has now been built. And very quickly too: the before and after photos were taken only a week apart. The bridge is exactly as wide as Graham and I thought it would be, ie not as wide as we were encouraged to believe ..... Our planning that gives an ankle-deep fording of the stream as an option looks to have been a wise move. Of course, all bets will be off if there's a lot of rain the day before the event.

I got to meet the farmer too: your archetypal laid-back West-Coast type. He's pleased to have a bridge for his quad-bike, as well as hard-core going down in the field entrances.

We share Torinturk with Moravians, together with some extra help from RAFO

and NOC (Nottingham). Our obligations start on Tuesday after day three, when we have to help dismantle the tents etc. Once delivered to Torinturk, we then have to put them up, and do all the taping of the Assembly Field. This is likely to be a job for part of the rest day. On Thursday itself, between the helping Clubs, we have three starts and finish/download to man, as well as the String Course. The main start will be for everyone except courses one to eight. It promises to be busy, but has the advantage of being close to the road through the glen. Somewhat controversially, the White Start has been split in two, with white and yellow standard (TD1/2) courses just over the bridge and very close to assembly. Orange standard (TD3) courses are the same direction, but further on.

The String Course is also close to the TD1/2 start, and Mary Ross and her team of little helpers is working on the controls and map. Mary will be looking for people to help her run the String course on the day.



As always, Interlopers Central will be our green'n'yellow Club Tents – yes!, two of them now - marked out by our banner. There'll be the usual miasma of pre-run nerves and post-run discussion, as well as information about helping at Torinturk. There'll also be the latest plans about the Club Barbeque, to be hosted by Tim Brand,



most likely in his back garden, but just possibly down on the beach (ten minutes walk) if the weather is really good.
